Survey will be done through Questionnaire method. Online exams consume less time, money and material also it is user friendly for people. We just require a device and network connection to run the exams properly. Students who live far from their schools or colleges found easy to give exams online instead of wasting time and cost in travelling. But some students face difficulty in adapting the new technology and they don't get such resources to take education and to give exams online with a device. - To simplify the seriousness of online exams during this pandemic.


Review of Literature:

1. Kotwal¹, Bhadke², Gunjal³, Biswas⁴ (IRJET-2016) explained about Online Examination System is a software solution, which allows any industry or institute to arrange, conduct and manage examinations via an online environment. 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2. Daniel Woldeabl and Thomas Brothen2, (2019) titled as 21stCentury Assessment: Online Proctoring, Test Anxiety, and Student Performance explained about online leaning. Conventional higher education institutions are also gradually embracing it across the United States. As online learning surfaces as the new model of contemporary education both in the United States and worldwide, ensuring exam integrity in the online environment is becoming a major challenge to many higher education institutions. To meet this challenge, many of these institutions are outsourcing the examination aspect of their education to online proctoring service providers. The study, which was conducted on a total of 631 students, assesses the effect of online proctored exams on student test anxiety and exam performance. This study shows that high trait test anxiety results in lower exam scores and that this is especially true for those students with high text anxiety taking exams in an online proctored setting.²






Do you follow all the rules and regulations during online exams made by your school/college? 500 responses





What type of technical issues do you face during online exams? 500 responses



Do you think online exams reduces competition among students? 500 responses



What type of effects you feel online exams will have on your career? 500 responses



According to you, what are the advantages of online exams? 500 responses



What are the problems you face in Online exams? 500 responses











Suggestions:

- 1. In online examination system I'd tracking features should be improved
- 2. To make the exams more impactful on students, teachers can take regular short exams rather than irregular long exams.
- 3. Teachers can make both objective and subjective type of questions to examine the students and to know about their conceptual knowledge.

4. If this system provides a chat bot which can make a direct communication between the students and examiner, also it lessens the burden of examiners to answer all the queries.

Limitations:

- Survey is limited to Navi Mumbai city only.
- This survey lacks personal interaction with the respondents.

Conclusion:

As per the study on impact of online examination system on students in Navi Mumbai area is not good from their career aspects. Maximum number of people have given such exams and they think that this system is acceptable as per the current situation but many people disagree from such type of exams.
